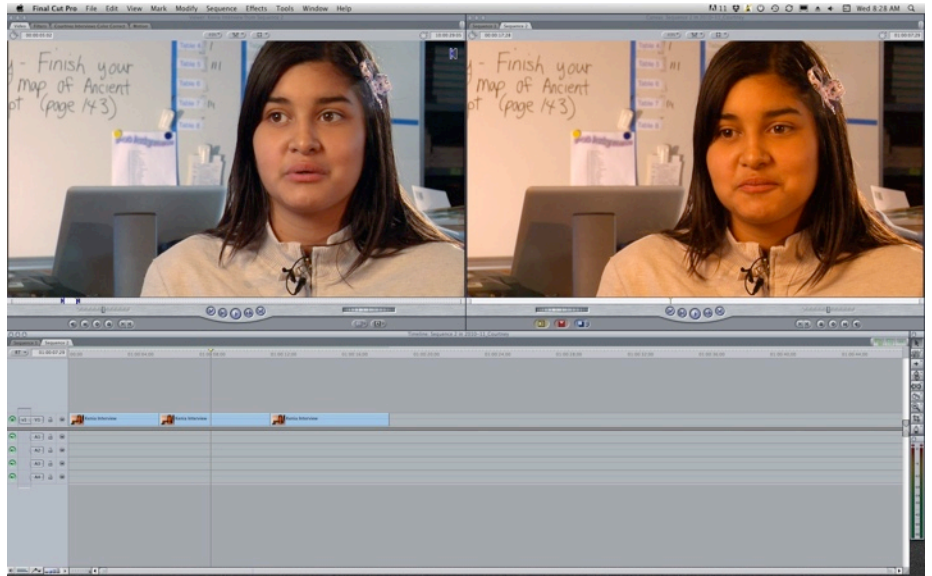


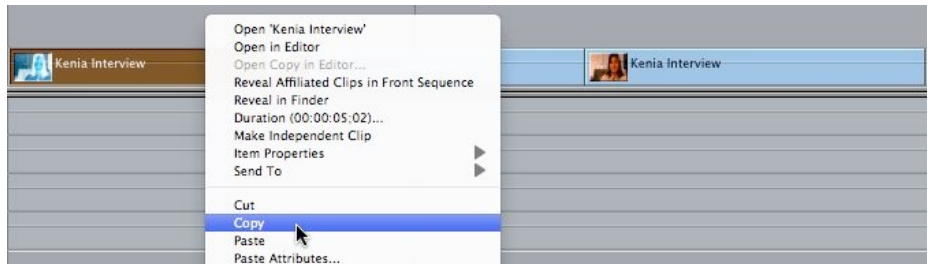
Using Paste Attributes in Final Cut Pro

1. Three clips shot under the same lighting are on the **Timeline**. The first clip has been loaded into the **Viewer** and color corrected with the **Color Corrector 3-way Filter**. The second clip is visible in the **Canvas**, uncorrected.
2. I **Control-clicked** on the first, corrected, clip and chose **Copy**.
3. I selected the other two (could be 20 or whatever), **Control-clicked** and chose **Paste Attributes**. On the **Paste Attributes Panel**, I chose **Filters**, and the **Color Corrector Filter** was copied to the other clips.
4. As you can see from the bottom panel, the clips match exactly. Note that while I did **Filters** here, there are many other parameters I could have chosen (most are found on the Motion tab).
5. Notice that below the **Paste Attributes** choice in panel 3 there is a **Remove Attributes** choice that can be used to quickly strip away parameters.

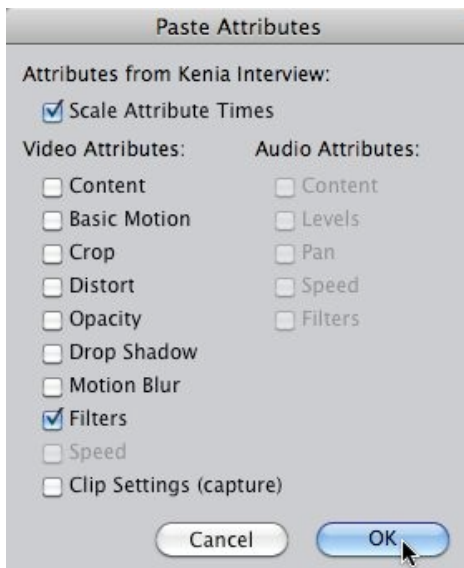
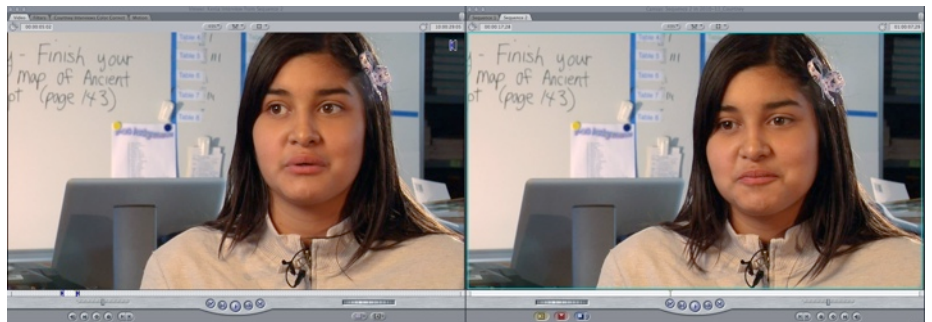
